PLANT PREPARATION GUIDELINES



How to participate: Simply pot up any extra perennial divisions, plants, seedlings or cuttings, in a correctly sized pot. Your donations will look their best if you're able to pot them up a week or two ahead of the sale, this allows them a bit of time to recover from any transplant shock. Keep them well watered and stored in a shady spot if possible.

We accept: Healthy annuals or perennials / fruit or vegetable seedlings.

Please remember to **LABEL** your treasures so buyers can choose wisely. Include such details on the tag as: plant name, flower colour, height, light & moisture requirements. Right plant in the right place = success!

IF you need labelling help, experienced club members will be on hand to give you a hand — trusty felt pens at the ready. Don't be shy to ask!

What to avoid: sad looking, droopy plants. Please donate only the sort of plants you would buy. They should be a credit to both you as a gardener and us as a horticultural club.
